

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How to access closed captions



- 1. At the bottom middle of your screen you should see a menu of options. If you can't see the menu, hover your mouse over the bottom middle of the screen.
- 2. Then click on the "CC" icon and a separate window with captions will appear.

2017-2021 American Community Survey


Demographic	Hayden Island/Expo census tracts*	Comparison to Portland-Vancouver Metro Area
Race	37% BIPOC	Greater share is BIPOC in HI/Expo area
Age	22% are 65+	Greater share of older adults in HI/Expo area
Income	27% low-income (less than 2x the federal poverty level)	Similar
Disability	15% live with a disability	Greater share of people with disabilities in HI/Expo area
Housing	71% own, 29% rent	Greater share of homeowners in HI/Expo area
Transportation to work	72% drive, 15% work from home, 7% take transit, 3% walk or bike	Similar
Vehicles available	6% of households do <u>not</u> have a vehicle	Smaller share of households do <u>not</u> have a vehicle in HI/Expo area
