
IBR Section 106 Deliverables

- Historic Built Environment Baseline Reports (OR and WA)
- Determination of Eligibility (DOE) Forms
- Finding of Effect (FOE) Forms
- DAHP/WISAARD Forms for WA properties
- Historic Built Environment Technical Report for the SDEIS
- Archaeology Technical Report for the SDEIS
- Programmatic Agreement



Programmatic Agreement

- Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) last step in Section 106 process
- MOA for previous project executed in 2011
- ► IBR Programmatic Agreement will replace existing MOA
- CRC mitigation to IBR Programmatic Agreement





Why is a Programmatic Agreement Appropriate for IBR?

- Involvement of many federally recognized Tribes.
- Involvement of multiple federal agencies with individual Section 106 compliance responsibilities.
- High potential for post-NEPA decision-making given the use of alternative approaches to project delivery.
- High probability of extremely sensitive cultural resources that may not be identified until after the completion of NEPA compliance and completion of detailed project design.

Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) requires federal agencies to consider the effects of projects on historic properties
