


## **URBAN DESIGN FOCUS AREAS**

Also, we will be **exploring a wide range of potential opportunities,** many of which will be dependent on greater level of detail that we will work towards as we advance the coordinated design.


The IBR program must **reserve space needed for stormwater and other maintenance and operations functions** before determining which specific locations will be available for other urban design programming.






Corridor Scale







## **EXISTING PLAN GUIDANCE**

2006 Vancouver City Center Vision Subarea Plan

- The plan recommends establishing an extension of Main Street Connection to South Waterfront Arterial between 5th Street to Columbia Way.
- The Plan calls for the redevelopment of the waterfront and the improvement of the Main Street Corridor and its connections as a central spine that will establish downtown as a regional center for commerce, culture and urban living.





### **DESIGN STATEMENT**



The infrastructure improvement facilitated through the implementation of IBR has created an opportunity to improve local connection network.




Presently, the Main Street in downtown Vancouver terminates at an off-ramp of I-5, but the upcoming bridge construction will alter this condition and offer a chance to connect Main Street to the Waterfront.



This presentation aims to evaluate existing and future conditions and limitations in order to identify strategic opportunities for enhancing the Main Street extension.




